Long Quotation

When a quotation is longer than four typed lines, double-space and indent the entire quotation one-half inch instead of using quotation marks. If it is one paragraph or less, begin its first line without extra paragraph indentation. Use ellipsis marks (\ldots) to show any omission from the middle.

Cynthia Griffin Wolff comments on Emily Dickinson's incisive use of language:

—Language, of course, was a far subtler weapon than a hammer. Dickinson's verbal maneuvers would increasingly reveal immense skill in avoiding a frontal – attack; she preferred the silent knife of irony to the strident battering of loud complaint.... Scarcely submissive, she had acquired the cool calculation of an assassin. (170-71)
