
## Citation at a glance: Article from a database (APA)

To cite an article from a database in APA style, include the following elements:

- 1 Author
- **2** Date of publication
- **3** Title of article
- 4 Name of periodical
- **5** Volume and issue numbers
- 6 Page numbers

- **7** DOI (digital object identifier)
- 8 Name of database (if there is no DOI)
- 9 Document number (if there is no DOI)
