
Citation at a glance: Article from a database MLA

To cite an article from a database in MLA style, include the following elements:

- 1 Author(s) of article
- 2 Title and subtitle of article
- **3** Title of journal, magazine, or newspaper
- 4 Volume and issue numbers (for journal)
- 5 Date of publication (including month or season, if any)
- 6 Page number(s) of article
- 7 Name of database
- 8 DOI or permalink, if available; otherwise, shortened URL of database
