Example

- 1. Place the central idea of the chapter in the center of the wheel.
- 2. Place supporting ideas on the spokes of the wheel.
- 3. Place important details on the lines attached to the spokes.

Tip: A good place to start is with chapter headings and subheadings. Then move on to terms in bold and graphics such as charts, tables, and diagrams. Textbooks often have study questions at the end of the chapter, which can give you clues about what the author considers the most important concepts.
