To cite an article from a database in APA style, include the following elements:

- 1 Author(s)
- 2 Date of publication
- 3 Title of article
- 4 Name of periodical
- 5 Volume number; issue number, if required (see p. 649)
- 6 Page range
- 7 DOI (digital object identifier)
- 8 URL for journal's home page (if there is no DOI)
