
Citation at a glance | Journal article from a database (*Chicago*)

To cite a journal article from a database in *Chicago* (CMS) style, include the following elements:

- 1 Author
- 2 Title of article
- 3 Title of journal
- 4 Volume and issue numbers
- 5 Year of publication
- Page number(s) cited (for notes); page range of article (for bibliography)
- 7 DOI; database name and article number; or "stable" or "persistent" URL for article
