## **How to Identify a Fragment**

## **OUESTIONS**

Does the word group have a subject? (Note that the subject may be understood as you. Example: [You] Close the door.)



**REVISION STRATEGIES** 

It is a fragment. Revise.



Does the word group have a complete verb? (Note that verbals are not complete verbs.)



It is a fragment. Revise.



3. Does the word group express a complete idea? If it begins with a subordinating word (although, since, if), a relative pronoun (that, which, who), or a transitional word or phrase (for example, likewise, also), does the word group contain an independent clause?



It is a fragment. Revise.



4. It is a sentence.
